Working in your room can easily get boring, so consider checking out one of these alternative study spots!

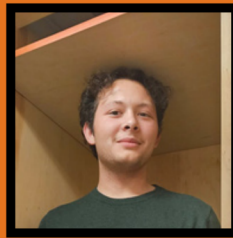
Starting with a classic, we have Torg Bridge. This is the bridge that you can see from the Drillfield which connects Torgerson Hall and Newman Library. Inside, there are rows and rows of large tables with lamps running down the middle and individual desks along the windows. There are plenty of outlets all around. Fair warning that this spot gets VERY busy in the evenings, especially during midterms and finals seasons, so the earlier you get here the better.

Hancock Hall is the building right next to Randolph Hall, the very old brick engineering building. There are some seats by the front doors but if you venture downstairs, there are comfy booths for getting assignments done with friends. This floor of Hancock also has some smaller desks, each with partitions on three sides to keep you undisturbed while solo studying.
