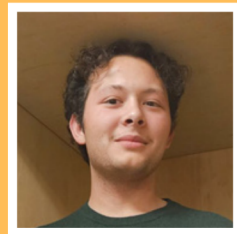

Side projects.

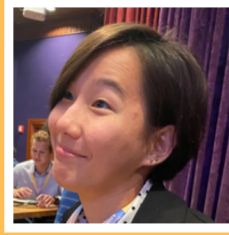
- Personally, I like to have a project to work on, I like making things. It will feel good to finally have time for projects and hobbies.
