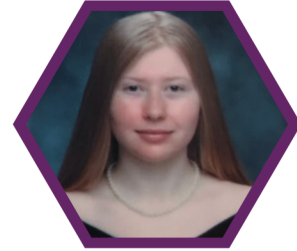

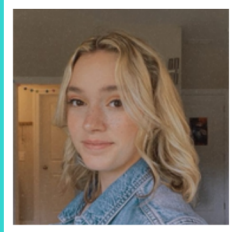

Virginia Tech's Market

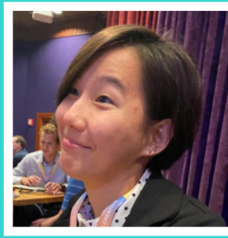
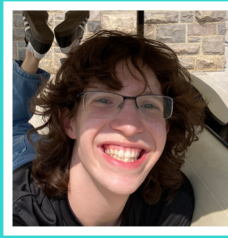
