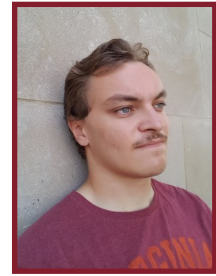

You can take up to 6 credits.

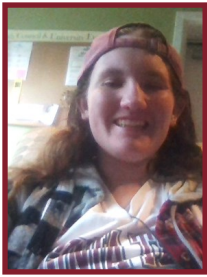

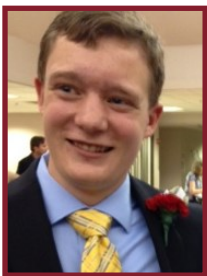


Halloween Bake Off: Get your friends to each make a Halloween treat. There are great ideas on websites like Pinterest and www.delish.com.

New Logo

In September, Virginia Tech released a new academic logo. Now the logos for both academics and athletics will look nearly identical. On top of the changes made to the

logo, the tagline, "Invent the Future," was removed.

Virginia Tech said that creating the logo itself cost around \$25,000, which is approximately the same amount as one year of tuition for an in-state student at Tech. The process for implementing the new logo onto signs and merchandise will cost around \$1 million. This money will come from the Virginia Tech Foundation funds.



The old academic logo was a maroon shield bearing the Pylons of War Memorial court with the

cenotaph in between. The new logo is no different than the athletics logo most of us recognize; the only differences is that the outlining the "VT" is thicker and the top left corner of the T is rounded.

The university tagline is also being phased out and there haven't been any plans revealed to replace it. "Invent the Future" had been



Virginia Tech's tagline since 2006. However, the marketing team has followed other universities around the country in removing the tagline.

Whether or not you like these changes, it is only the academics logo that's changing. While I like the old logo, I think we should give this new logo a chance even if it really seems pointlessly similar to the athletics logo and is costing the university a lot of money to implement.
